These notes should be typed, developed and refined. They are the foundation for your project and writing -5-3 Sources due Friday $\frac{3}{13}$ EOC.

Basic Requirements:

- 3. All research must be from credible primary or secondary sources (no Wikipedia, dictionaries, online textbooks, or encyclopedias allowed!)
- 4. ALL NOTES MUST BE IN YOUR OWN WORDS. DO NOT CUT AND PASTE!!!

Research Note Format: Format Summary
For each source you use, you should have research notes in the following format:

- 1. Citation: Cite completely using MLA format
- 2. <u>Summary:</u> Summarize the main points this source made about your topic in one full paragraph. Make sure this is IN YOUR OWN WORDS!

- 3. Evaluation: Explain how this source will help you to develop your project. You might discuss any of the following... Paragraph form
 - a. Interesting information you learned At least 2 of these
 - b. How this connects to your previous research
 - c. What insight this gives you into your research topic
 - d. New ideas you now have for your project
 - e. Other ...?
- 4. <u>Evidence:</u> Pull out 2-4 key passages that you might want to use in your project or writing. Type them word for word, and note the page and paragraph (or url).
